The show starts at 8:00 PM. The theatre will get darker and the show will start. I will try to be as quiet as I can so that I can hear everything.



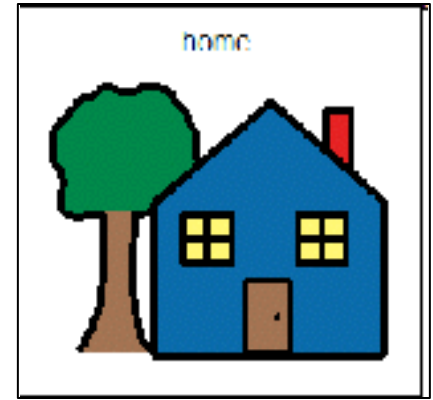
