


Adriana Hokk – (Asst. Choreographer/Dance Captain)

to venture once again behind the production desk, this time as assistant choreographer! And now it is time to choose: will you follow the path to greatness?



WVLO for the first time; it's also his first time as an assistant music director. Huge thanks to Mark and Lysander for having faith in him!


